District Grants 2017-2018

Criteria for selection for D 6910

When considering the selection and funding of District Grants, the below criteria will be considered by the selection committee composed of the District Rotary Foundation Chair(DRFC), the District Rotary Service Chair(DRSC), and the District Grants Coordinator(DGC). This committee will make recommendations to the District Governor for approval. Revised 7-20-16

- -Meets the April 30, 2017 deadline for submission of request.
- -Short term (one year) Grants that supports TRF Mission.
- -Project can be Domestic/International/Scholarships/VTTs.
- -DDF matches will only match the Clubs contributions.
- -Usually one DDF match per Club.
- -To what degree is the project "Sustainable".
- -Clubs are current on RI and District dues/fees.
- -Clubs are current on past District/Global Grant reports. A Club that has been delinquent in filing a previous Final Report will not receive matching District DDF the following year.
 - -Club must be "Qualified" with a signed "MOU".
 - -A Rotary Club MUST make a contribution to the TRF to get DDF
- -One active Rotarian involved in the Foundation MUST attend the annual training seminar on Grant Management and Grant Writing.

-If a District Grant request is for a project outside the USA, the Club requesting the District Grant MUST fill out a preliminary Global Grant application to assure that the project has a reliable "in country" sponsor and is a "sustainable" project.

- -District Grants must support one of the RI Six Areas of Focus
 - Peace and Conflict resolution
 - -Maternal and child health
 - -Disease prevention and treatment
 - -Basic education and literacy
 - -Water and sanitation
 - Economic and community development

-Additional Foundation Dollar bonuses will be announced for the Rotary year 2017-2018 that support PI and Membership.
